'After the birth of my second child, I realised that I'd put all my own writing dreams on hold, as if I was waiting for my life to begin when the children were older. That's when I started writing **Returning to Adelaide** in the GoogleDocs App on my iPhone. It may sound strange but, because I spent so many hours per day breastfeeding my daughter, it was the only way I could do it!' the multi-award finalist explains.

The story follows the life of Adelaide Jones, a wife and mother who, when her perfect suburban life begins to unravel, is forced on a journey of self-discovery to the Greek island of Ikaria. 'I wanted to create a situation that made it not only acceptable, but necessary, for a mother travel to the other side of the world, solo,' says Anne. 'I wrote it at a stage in my life when a trip to Kmart alone felt like Club Med, so being *forced* into a trip to the Greek Islands was a total fantasy situation!'

What follows is once-in-a-lifetime adventure which ultimately reignites Adelaide's tenacity.
